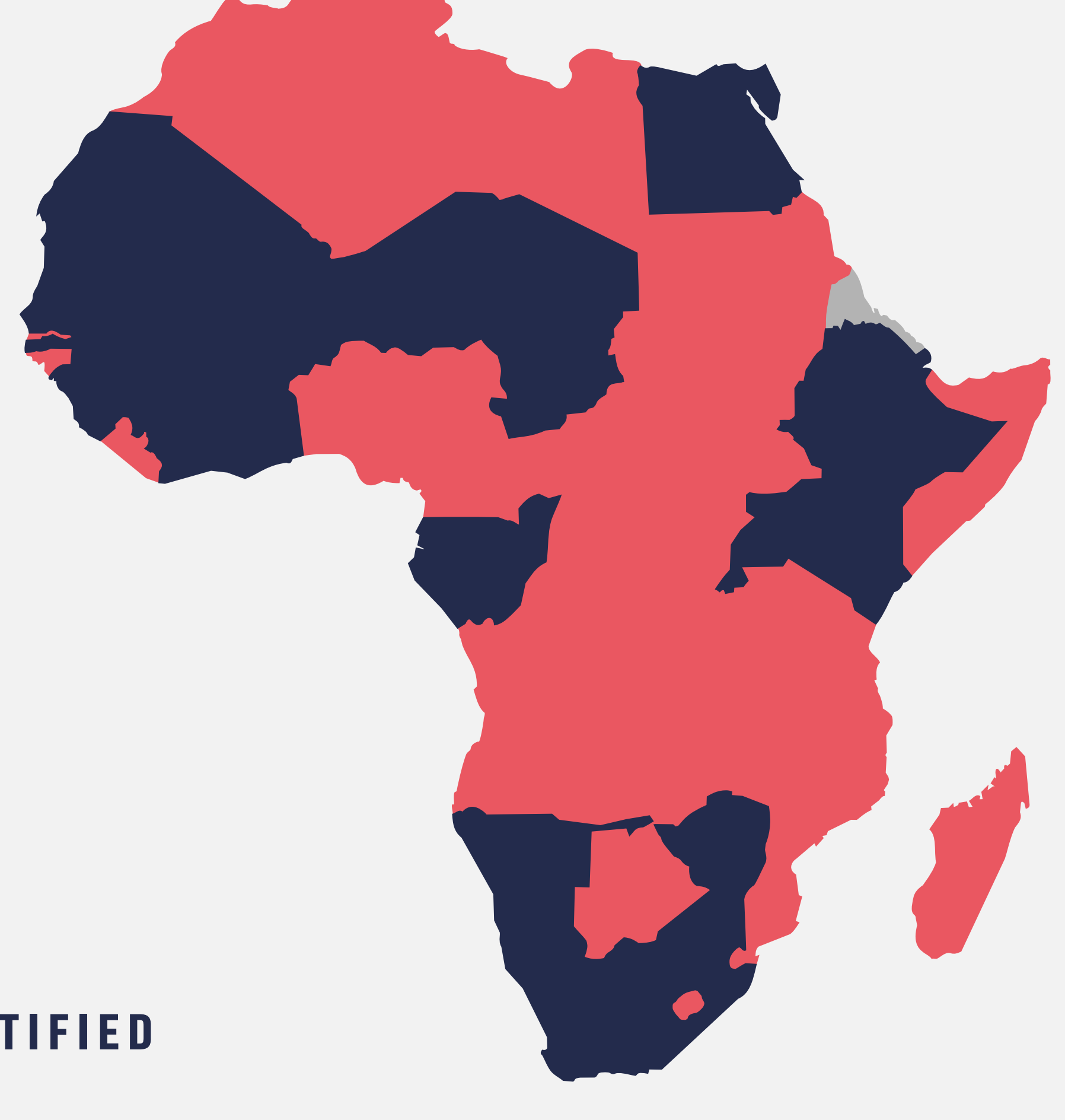

BILLION. THE POPULATION OF AFRICA BY 2050



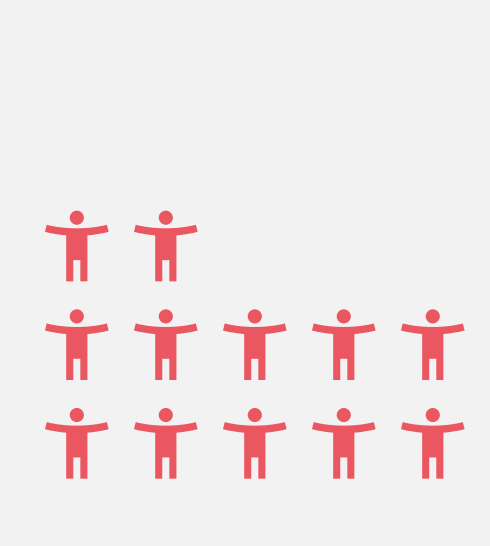

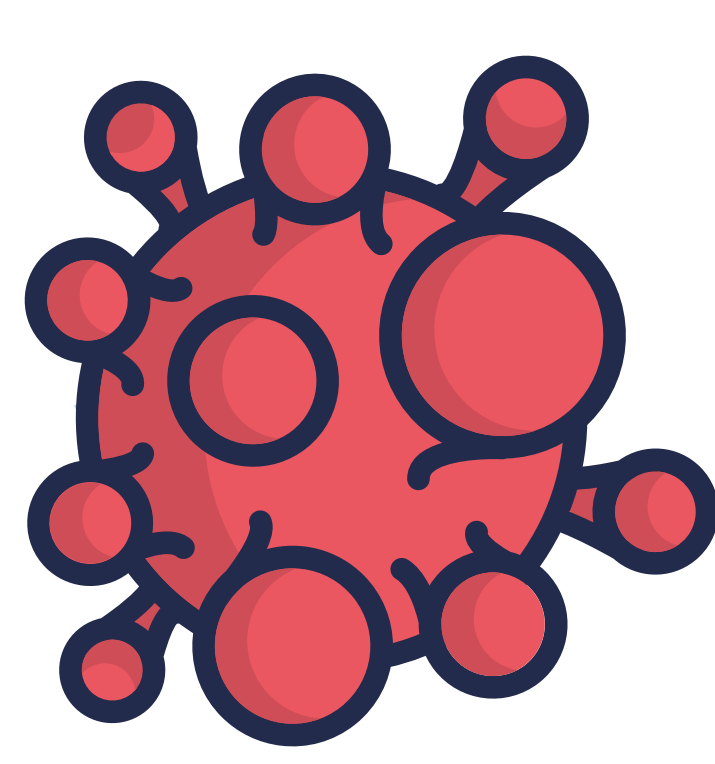

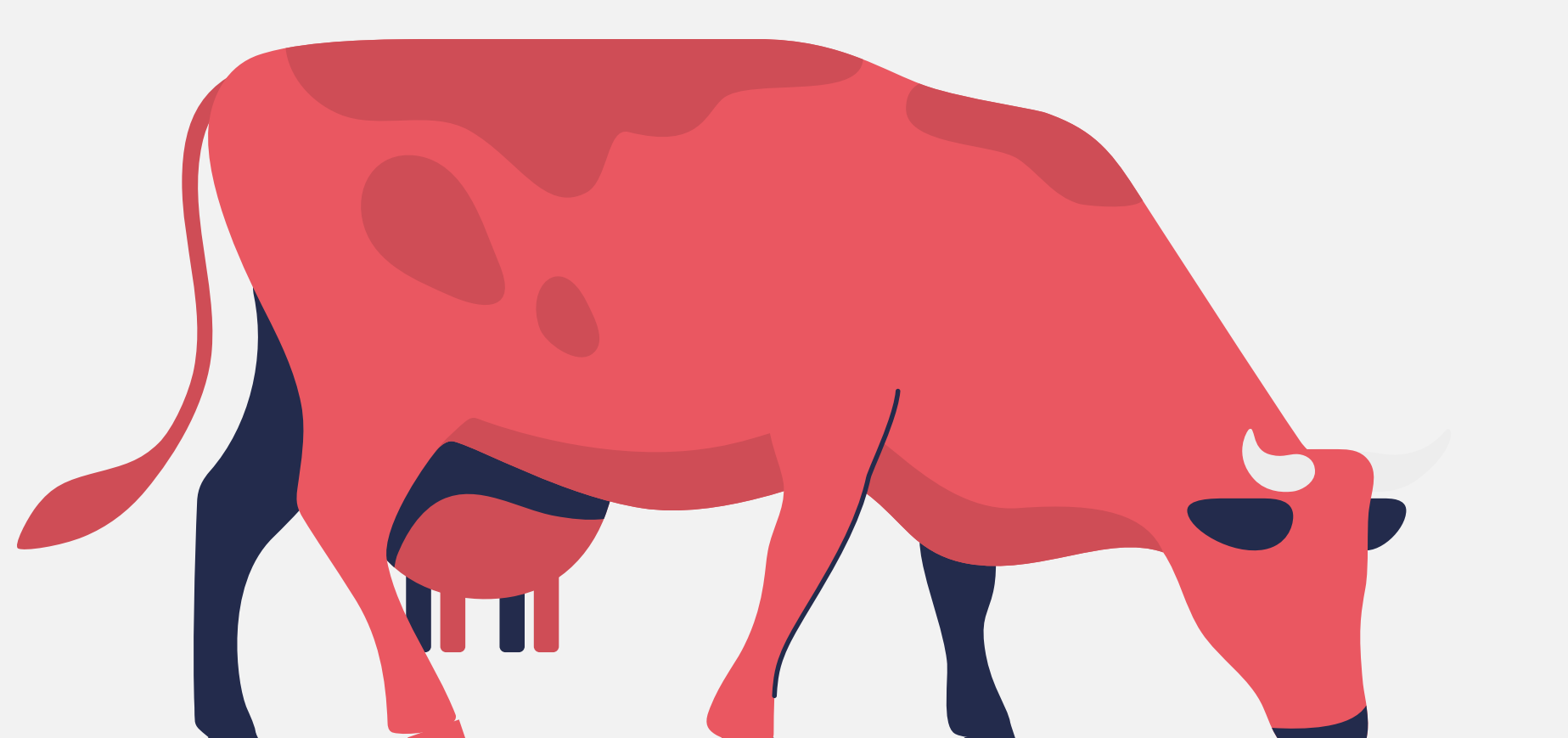

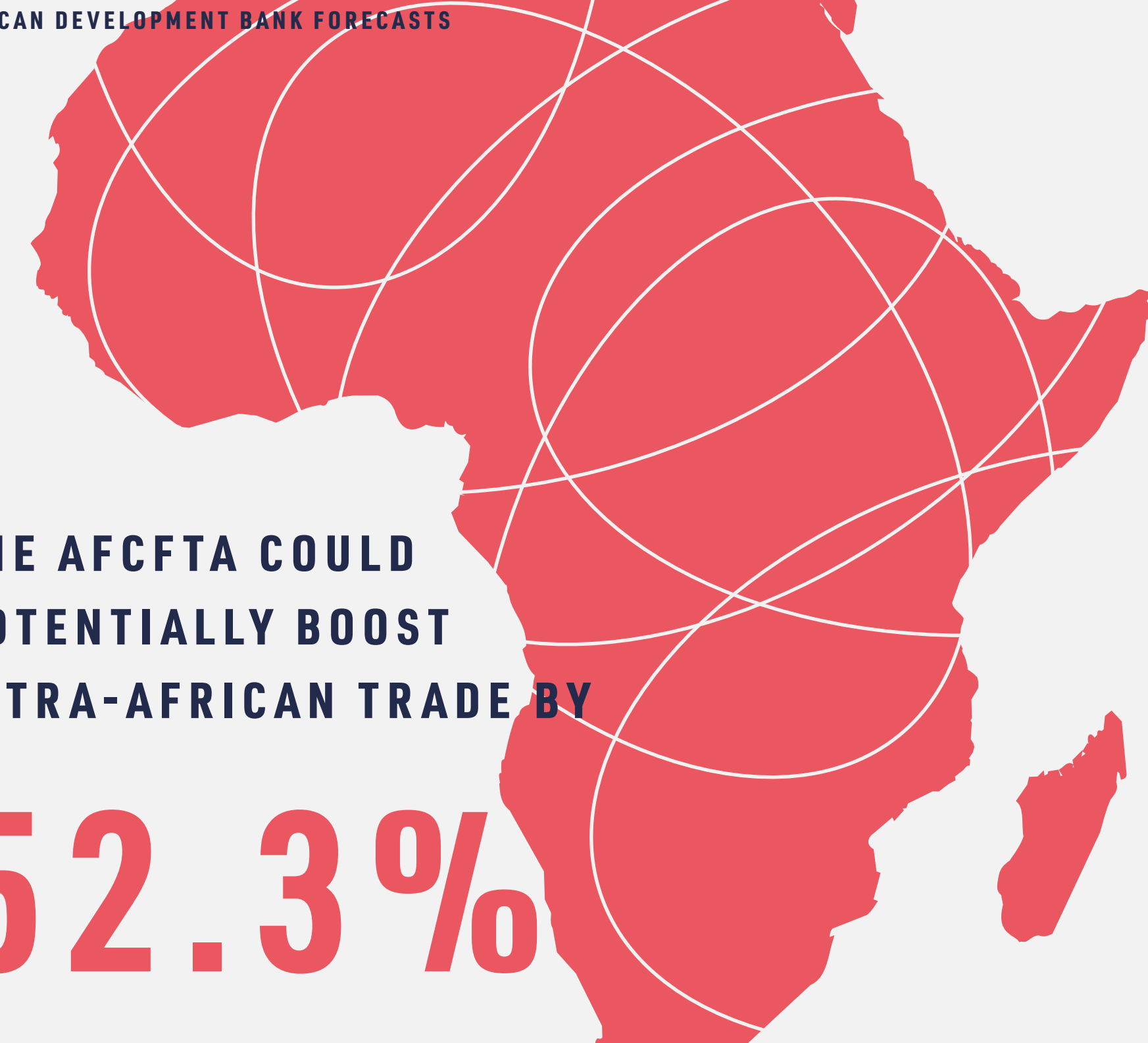
